THE FUTURE OF **VILUSEN RINNE WILL BE DECIDED THIS AUTUMN**

THIS summer, we were able to en- so we will have to wait and see iov good weather. Summer events also brought us joy now that they are back after being on pause because of the COVID-19 pandemic. Meeting other people through tenant activities is important for many people.

In contrast, the situation in society is challenging. The costs of living are increasing and inflation is in full swing. Fortunately, the Finnish government has been able to alleviate the coming winter's energy situation by reducing the valueadded tax on electricity to ten per cent from December to April.

This year, VTS-kodit Board members have also been busy with negotiations about the future of Vilusen Rinne Oy. The Corporate Section of the Tampere City Board has decided to divide Vilusen Rinne into two separate limited liability companies. One of the two companies will incorporate the state-subsidised ARA housing stock of Vilusen Rinne, while the other company will incorporate the soon-to-be-vacant housing stock not subject to ARA restrictions.

the entire housing stock of Vilusen Rinne should be transferred to the management of Tampereen Vuokratalosäätiö sr. We have discussed this matter with the Corporate Section in good cooperation, but the final decision is up to them,

what type of proposal the Corporate Section decides to make. The final decision about the sale will be made by Tampere City Council by the end of this year.


The environmental programme that is part of VTS-kodit's new strategy defines objectives regarding such things as construction and renovation, waste management, energy matters and development collaboration. VTS-kodit will not compromise on comfort of living, but the plan is to reduce the costs of living.

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SAVING ENERGY ONE DROP AT A TIME

THIS autumn will see the start of the 'A degree lower' campaign launched by Finnish government agencies. Its purpose is to inspire at least 75 per cent of Finns to save energy. VTS-kodit will also take part in the campaign.

Saving energy is necessary because the Russian invasion of

Ukraine has changed the energy situation in Europe. The availability and price of energy impact the daily lives of the entire population of Finland. Through small everyday actions, we can all help improve the energy situation in Finland, and doing so will also generate savings in our living costs.

At VTS-kodit, we encourage all of our tenants to take up the challenge: let's reduce our energy use together by one degree!

Turning attention to domestic hot water

Did you know that domestic hot

water costs up to approximately twice as much as cold water? Most VTS-kodit buildings are equipped with apartment-specific water meters, meaning that the tenants pay exactly according to how much water they use. So you should make sure not to waste hot water.

There are many easy ways to save

water in daily life. You should wait until the washing machine and dishwasher are full before running a wash cycle. You can put leftover water used in cooking aside to cool and then use it for watering the plants or flushing the toilet, for example.

When washing up, water easi-

ly goes to waste if you leave the tap running while you brush your teeth or lather up with shampoo. So turn off the tap and shower when you do not need them. You can reduce your water consumption simply by spending a few minutes less in the shower and lowering the water pressure.



GUIDE CHILDREN IN SAVING WATER

THE youngest members of the family often linger in the shower to play with water. You should teach children not to waste water. Supervise your offspring when they are washing up and teach them to be efficient about it. This will also lower the water bill.





SMALL THINGS MATTER

THINGS that seem minor in daily life may be major at annual level. For example, spending slightly less time in the shower may lead to considerable annual savings.

- ► 15 minutes in the shower per day = approx. EUR 450 per year
- ▶ 5 minutes in the shower per day= approx. EUR 150 per year

This calculation is based on the assumption that energy costs EUR 0.10/kWh and water costs EUR 3.4/m³.

GOOD PROPERTY MAINTENANCE SAVES ENERGY

"VTS-kodit has been working to save energy for many years. We try to select energy-efficient solutions in the construction and renovation phases," says **Raimo Leskinen**, building services manager at VTS-kodit.

"We monitor the operation of all of our properties and the condition of their air conditioning and heating equipment. We make sure not to heat our buildings too much, and we continuously develop ways to optimise the use of electricity," explains building services expert **Petri Kotomäki**.

Also of importance is our quick response to fault notifications. By fixing problems and faults quickly, we prevent them from escalating. This allows us to prevent energy from being wasted.





A LEAKY tap, a front door that does not close properly, and other small faults in the building may actually waste a lot of energy.

If a tap leaks a couple of drops per minute, it could be wasting several litres of water per month. A gap in the front door constantly lets heat escape.

So submit a fault notification as soon as you notice an issue in need of fixing in your building. This will allow us to fix any faults quickly, without wasting water and heat.







SAVE ELECTRICITY - WITHOUT COMPROMISING ON COMFORT

THE fluctuation in the price of electricity has caused concern in the last few months. VTS-kodit is also currently considering ways to save electricity.

However, VTS-kodit will not compromise on safety and the comfort of living. The objective is to save electricity by eliminating unnecessary consumption and optimising electricity use.

Tenant committees can help identify potential savings by monitoring how their buildings operaunused sauna hours helps save electricity.

Monitor your electricity consumption and save on your electricity bill

MANY people are now considering ways to keep their electricity bill at a reasonable level. It is easier to identify savings opportunities if you know how much electricity you use at home and when you use it.

Monitoring your electricity use is easy with the help of services offered by power companies. For example, the Sähkis service of Tampereen Sähkölaitos allows you to monitor your consumption by the hour. Many other major power companies offer similar services that are also available as handy mobile versions.

HOUSING


 Quickly report any leaking equipment and other issues in your apartment to the maintenance company.



- Turn off the lights when you do not need them.
- Disconnect chargers from the outlet after use.
- ▶ Turn off the television, computer and gaming equipment when you are not using them.

KITCHEN

If you have a dishwasher, avoid washing dishes by hand.



Try recipes that you can cook in a single pot.

Use cooled potato cooking water to water the plants.



BATHROOM

▶ Keep the tap turned off while brushing your teeth.



- Spend a couple of minutes less in the shower.
- Keep the shower turned off while lathering up with soap.
- Wash full loads of laundry.

Electric scooter skid marks are costly

IMPROPER use of electric scooters has been noted in several VTS-kodit buildings. In some buildings, braking in stairwells has caused the electric scooter's rotating tyre to burn through the hallway carpet. Similar marks have also been found on the lower parts of walls and lift floors.

Children and young people in particular may think that playing with electric scooters is fun, however, repairing the damage often costs thousands of euros.

We would like to remind our tenants that riding an electric scooter in the stairwell is prohibited. When parking a scooter, make sure not to block doorways. Please also remember to supervise children and young people's use of electric scoo-
